



Derwentwater Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding

For the school year of 2016/17, we received an allocation of £10,735 in School PE and Sports Premium money.

As a school, we are committed to ensuring that our pupils have access to high quality PE lessons and are able to take part in competitions. In addition to our Sport's Premium Funding, we invest further funding from our school's budget to ensure all our development plans for PE and healthy living are achieved.

The money is broken down in the following ways to ensure a positive and sustainable impact on the children at Derwentwater.

Specialist Sports Coaches

At Derwentwater, we are spending the money on employing specialist PE teachers/qualified coaches from J&C Academy.

93% of surveyed pupils say that they enjoy their PE lessons.

Cost: £9,500

Featherstone School Sport Partnership (FSSP)

As a member of the Featherstone School Sport Partnership, Derwentwater has access to a vast range of competitions across a long list of sporting activities. This provides a key focus for children as they move up through the school as well as fostering life-long interests and passions, crucial for physical and mental wellbeing.

These are the competitions which we have entered: Year 5/6 Boys' Football, Year 5/6 Girls' Football, Ealing Cross Country, Brownlee Foundation Triathlon, Ealing Girls' Cricket, Ealing Boys' Cricket, Perivale Athletics and Ealing Netball competitions.

Children from Derwentwater were highly competitive at these events. The girls' team won the Ealing Cross Country.

The partnership also provides a wealth of training and CPD opportunities for staff, including PE leader training, guidance on curriculum provision and First Aid & Health and Safety updates.

Within this, FSSP also provides a ‘PE mentor’ who, on weekly visits, works closely with staff on teaching and learning, assessment and intra-school competition. Through this relationship, we also set termly targets and evaluate the impact of the PE provision to ensure we are constantly improving. This guidance has been vital in providing the PE Leader with a clear understanding of PE provision across the school and identifying targets for the future.

Teachers from Years 3, 4 and 5 as well as the school’s PE Leader have attended training and received support from the partnership. 100% of attending staff found the training useful and stated that it would have a ‘positive influence on their future teaching.’ PE Leader training has been and will continue to be a great opportunity to develop and grow in this role for the overall benefit of the school.

In the Spring 2017 survey, the majority of children at Derwentwater indicated that they would “love” intra-school competitions. This has been implemented successfully and will continue to be a focus for the Summer Term 2017.

The partnership network meetings have provided us with opportunities to make links with local schools and organisations. For example, we now have London Tigers providing expert coaching for girls on Tuesdays after school.
